

In copyright-infringement litigation involving music, a plaintiff must prove two elements: ownership and copying. Direct evidence of copying is rarely available, so a plaintiff can prove copying by showing that the defendant had access to the copyrighted work and a “substantial similarity”. Proving substantial similarity almost always requires the testimony of an expert musicologist.

DUANE CLARK

Duane Clark has been an owner of FBMM for more than a decade, is an award-winning business manager and is a trusted adviser to his roster of clients, including top recording and touring artists. As president, he is also responsible for leading FBMM's strategic plan implementation that will ensure the continuity of its clients' financial management and security for years to come.

Duane is a three-time winner of the Country Music Association's Business Manager of the Year award. He has been included on lists in various industry trade publications, such as Billboard's Country Power Players, Billboard's Top Business Managers and Variety's Business Managers Elite. Music Row Magazine has recognized Duane as a Nashville leader for the past four years.

Duane was the recipient of the ACM Service Award named in honor of Mae Boren Axton. This award is presented to an outstanding country music artist, duo/group, or industry leader in recognition of years of dedication and service to the Academy of Country Music.

Duane has served on the ACM board of directors since 2009 and continues to serve as a member of the Chairman's Circle. From 2011 through 2016, Duane served as treasurer of the Academy's board, a role that put him in the trenches during the five-year planning process leading up to the 50th anniversary telecast of the ACM Awards at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, TX, in 2015. He worked alongside the ACM's CEO and staff while meeting with Texas state officials and representatives of the Dallas Cowboys organization for the event, which still holds recognition by the Guinness World Records for the highest attendance at an awards show broadcast (70,252). He served as chairman of the organization from 2018 to 2019.

Duane also served as treasurer for ACM's Lifting Lives, the philanthropic partner of the organization that provides aid in times of need, with a focus on health-related initiatives. He is a member of the Country Music Association, the Academy of Country Music and The Recording Academy and is a charter member and alumnus of SOLID.

HON. ALBERT ARNOLD GORE, JR.

Former Vice President Al Gore is the founder and chairman of The Climate Reality Project, a nonprofit devoted to solving the climate crisis, a founding partner and chairman of Generation Investment Management, and a co-founder of Climate TRACE. He is also a partner at Kleiner Perkins Caufield & Byers, a member of Apple Inc.'s board of directors, and a member of the World Economic Forum's board of trustees.

Gore was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1976, 1978, 1980, and 1982 and to the U.S. Senate in 1984 and 1990. He was inaugurated as the 45th vice president of the United States on January 20, 1993, and served eight years.

He is the author of the #1 New York Times best-sellers "An Inconvenient Truth" and "The Assault on Reason," the NYT best-sellers "Earth in the Balance," "Our Choice: A Plan To Solve the Climate Crisis," "The Future: Six Drivers of Global Change," and most recently, The New York Times best-seller "An Inconvenient Sequel: Truth to Power."

He is the subject of the documentary movie "An Inconvenient Truth," which won two Oscars in 2006 -- and a second documentary in 2017, "An Inconvenient Sequel: Truth to Power." In 2007, Gore was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize, along with the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, for "informing the world of the dangers posed by climate change."

GENERAL (RET) KENNETH F. "FRANK" MCKENZIE, JR.

General (Ret) Kenneth F. "Frank" McKenzie, Jr. became the Executive Director of the University of South Florida's Global and National Security Institute in May 2022. In July 2022, he also became the Executive Director of the Florida Center for Cybersecurity, also known as Cyber Florida. He is the former USMC Commander, U.S. Central Command. As the Commanding Officer of the 22d MEU (SOC), he led the MEU on combat deployments to Afghanistan in 2004 and Iraq in 2005-06. In 2006-07 he served as the Military Secretary to the 33rd and 34th Commandants of the Marine Corps.

In 2008, he was selected by the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff to be the Director of the Chairman's New Administration Transition Team (CNATT). In this capacity, he coordinated the efforts of the Joint Staff and the combatant commands in preparing for and executing a wartime transition of administrations.

MCKENZIE, *Continued*

In 2017 General McKenzie was promoted to the grade of General and assumed command of U.S. Central Command (CENTCOM) in March 2019. He relinquished command of CENTCOM and retired from the Marine Corps in 2022, completing over 42 years of service.

General McKenzie is currently the President of the Board of Directors of the Institute of Applied Engineering at the University of South Florida, a Distinguished Senior Fellow on National Security at the Middle East Institute, a Member of the International Advisory Committee of the National Council on U.S. Arab relations, and a Member of the National Security Advisory Council, U.S. Global Leadership Coalition.

MICHELE ROBERTS, FELLOW

Prior to her retirement in January 2022, Ms. Roberts had, since 2014, served as the Executive Director of the National Basketball Players Association ["NBPA"]. In that role she was tasked with working on behalf of NBA players to ensure their rights were protected and they were fairly compensated for the value they bring to the sport and their impact on the community. Prior to joining the NBPA, she was an esteemed trial lawyer with Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom. Her practice focused on complex civil and white-collar criminal litigation before state and federal courts and in administrative proceedings. Ms. Roberts has tried more than 150 cases to jury verdicts, representing clients in a wide variety of areas, including products liability, white collar, racketeering, securities regulation violations, Title VII issues and premises liability. She is a top-ranked attorney who has received numerous accolades from *Chambers Global*, *Chambers USA* and *Benchmark Litigation*, among other notable publications.

Ms. Roberts worked for eight years in the office of the Public Defender Service for the District of Columbia, where she was named Chief of the Trial Division. Ms. Roberts is a frequent lecturer and presenter to both the bench and bar on a variety of topics related to litigation and trial practice. She taught trial advocacy as an adjunct member of the faculty at Harvard Law School and as an instructor with the National Institute of Trial Advocacy.

Ms. Roberts currently serves on the boards of Cresco Labs, The Marshall Project, The Bronx Defenders, and Wesleyan University, her alma mater.

ERICA ROSA

Erica Rosa, owner and vice president of Royalties and Contract Compliance at FBMM, joined the firm in 2009 as its first full-time royalty employee. Erica is responsible for overseeing all day-to-day operations and royalty work for FBMM's roster of internationally known recording artists, producers and songwriters. During her career, Erica has conducted successful recording and publishing royalty audits, profit participation audits, and merchandise and brand audits worldwide. She also specializes in providing advisory and analytical services for music catalog sales and contract negotiations. In 2015, Erica created and implemented FBMM's record label administration division, providing royalty accounting services to independent record label and self-releasing artists.

Erica is the SOURCE Nashville board secretary and Hall of Fame Awards chair. She is a member of the Leadership Music class of 2023 and a former advisory committee member for the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum's Troubadour Society. She also serves as an area operations and finance director for Phi Mu Fraternity, Inc.

Erica is a member of several professional organizations, including the Country Music Association, the Academy of Country Music, the Recording Academy and the Association of Independent Music Publishers, and an alumna of the Women's Music Business Association and the Society of Leaders in Development (SOLID).

CHUCK ROSENBERG

Chuck Rosenberg held numerous senior positions in the United States Department of Justice – as the United States Attorney – the chief law enforcement officer – in both the Eastern District of Virginia and the Southern District of Texas, as the senior counselor for national security to one Director of the FBI, and as the Chief of Staff to another FBI Director, as counselor to the Attorney General of the United States, as the Chief of Staff to the Deputy Attorney General of the United States, and as the Administrator of the Drug Enforcement Administration – a position from which he resigned in 2017.

Chuck joined the Department of Justice directly out of law school, through the Attorney General's Honors Program, and quickly found the job he enjoyed most - as an Assistant United States Attorney in the Eastern District of Virginia, in Norfolk and Alexandria. There, he tried dozens of criminal cases before juries and briefed and argued many of those cases to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit. Chuck prosecuted complex financial fraud crimes, public corruption, violent crimes, and national security cases.

ROSENBERG, *Continued*

Chuck currently works as a legal analyst for MSNBC and NBC, as a senior counsel for a Washington, D.C. law firm, and as an adjunct professor at the Georgetown University School of Foreign Service, where he teaches National Security Law and Policy. He is a graduate of Tufts University (BA), Harvard University (MPP), and the University of Virginia (JD). Chuck is also the host of the acclaimed podcast, *The Oath*, which finished a four season run with more than 12 million downloads.

SUZANNE SPAULDING

Suzanne Spaulding is senior adviser for homeland security and director of the Defending Democratic Institutions project at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS). She also served as a member of the Cyberspace Solarium Commission. Prior to joining CSIS, Ms. Spaulding was Undersecretary at the Department of Homeland Security, leading the National Protection and Programs Directorate (NPPD), which has since been renamed to the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA).

Ms. Spaulding served under Republican and Democratic administrations and for both sides of the aisle in Congress. She has formerly served as Assistant General Counsel at the CIA, General Counsel for the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, and Minority Staff Director for the House of Representatives Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence.

HONOURABLE GEORGE R. STRATHY

The Honourable George R. Strathy retired as Chief Justice of Ontario and President of the Court of Appeal for Ontario on August 31, 2022, having served on that Court for nine years. In that capacity, he heard a wide range of complex civil, commercial, family and criminal matters, regularly authoring judgments in all areas. Prior to his appointment to the Court of Appeal, he served as a Judge of the Ontario Superior Court of Justice for five years. For three of those years, he was a member of the Class Actions team, responsible for the judicial oversight and management of approximately 80 class proceedings.

Prior to his appointment to the bench, Mr. Strathy practiced general civil litigation for thirty years, with a specialty in domestic and international maritime, commercial and insurance matters.

He graduated from McGill University in 1970 with an Honours B.A. and received an M.A. in International Politics from the University of Toronto, where he was a Woodrow Wilson Fellow. He graduated from the Faculty of Law of the

University of Toronto in 1974 as the Gold Medalist and was called to the Ontario Bar in 1976.

During his 30-year career as a lawyer, Mr. Strathy was also involved in legal education, teaching Maritime Law for many years at the Faculty of Law of the University of Toronto and Environmental Law at the Faculty of Engineering of the University of Toronto. He authored two books, *The Law and Practice of Marine Insurance in Canada* (Butterworths, Lexis-Nexis, 2003) and *The Law and Practice of General Average in Canada* (1995).

As Chief Justice of Ontario, Mr. Strathy initiated the modernization of the Court's technology, overseeing the transformation of the Court of Appeal to a paperless operation in the course of the Covid-19 pandemic and managing the acquisition and launch of a state-of-the-art case management system. He was a Vice Chair of the Executive Committee of the Canadian Judicial Council and Chair of a committee to promote effective case management of civil, family and criminal proceedings. He actively supported equity and diversity in the bar and on the bench and was an advocate for mental health and wellness in the legal profession.

JUSTICE DWIGHT E. TARWATER, FELLOW

Dwight E. Tarwater was confirmed by the General Assembly in 2023 as the newest justice on the Tennessee Supreme Court. Justice Tarwater was nominated by Governor Bill Lee.

Justice Tarwater was born and raised in Knoxville. He earned a B.A. in political science and his law degree from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville.

After working as a judicial law clerk for Judge Houston M. Goddard of the Tennessee Court of Appeals, Eastern Section in Knoxville, Justice Tarwater joined the law firm Egerton, McAfee, Armistead and Davis and four short years later was named a partner.

Justice Tarwater developed a national reputation in handling complex litigation cases. He has managed hundreds of complex cases at the trial and appellate levels in both federal and state courts and has developed a particular talent for legal discovery, expert testimony, and jury trials. As a result, he has handled cases in all three Grand Divisions of Tennessee and more than 20 states. In 2006, Justice Tarwater was inducted into the College.

From 2014 to 2019, Justice Tarwater served as general counsel to former Governor Bill Haslam. Justice Tarwater proposed reform measures in criminal justice, juvenile justice, law enforcement, and drug treatment as well as advised the Governor on criminal law issues involving defendants, such as extraditions, sentencing, and clemency requests, including those in capital cases.

TARWATER, *Continued*

Recognizing the impact even modest legal guidance can have on an individual person, Justice Tarwater has consistently accepted cases pro bono from Legal Aid of East Tennessee as well as accepted other cases at reduced fees. Justice Tarwater served on the board of directors of LAET, the Volunteer Legal Assistance Program and the Pro Bono Project.

WILLIAM T. (BILL) WHITAKER

Bill Whitaker is an award-winning journalist and 60 Minutes correspondent who has covered major news stories, domestically and across the globe, for more than four decades with CBS News. He joined 60 Minutes in 2014 and the 2023-24 season is his 10th on the broadcast. Whitaker first arrived at CBS News as a reporter in 1984.

Whitaker has been honored with multiple journalism awards, including two Alfred I. duPont-Columbia University Awards (2023, 2017), a Peabody Award (2018), the RTDNA's highest honor, the Paul White Award for career achievement (2018) and numerous Emmy Awards.

Most recently at 60 Minutes, Whitaker interviewed French President Emmanuel Macron on the war in Ukraine and France's relationship with the U.S. He reported from Uganda on virus hunters searching for new pathogens to help prevent another pandemic. Whitaker sat down with former senior technical adviser Denver Riggleman who was inside the January 6th committee.

Whitaker's investigation with The Washington Post into the origins of the opioid crisis has won more awards than any other work at 60 Minutes. The first report in the two-part series revealed how the DEA's efforts to curb the epidemic were hampered by a law pushed by drug industry lobbyists. The report was credited with forcing the law's chief sponsor, a congressman, to withdraw his nomination for the Trump Administration's drug czar. The joint reporting won eight awards including a duPont-Columbia University Award, a Peabody Award, an Emmy Award, and an RTDNA Murrow Award.

Domestically, his stories have provided keen insights into the hot-button issue of race and policing in America with his reports from Cleveland, Chicago and most recently, Tulsa, Oklahoma, where he landed the first interview with the city police officer accused of manslaughter for shooting an unarmed Black man. His stories have drawn attention to death penalty issues in the U.S. and America's heroin epidemic. Whitaker chronicled the epic battle to capture

and hold Mexico's infamous drug lord Joaquin "El Chapo" Guzman, gaining rare access to investigations on both sides of the border.

Prior to joining 60 Minutes, Whitaker covered virtually every major news story on the west coast since he was posted to the Los Angeles bureau in 1992. Before his assignment to Los Angeles, Whitaker served as CBS News' Tokyo correspondent (1989-92). He covered stories throughout Asia, including the pro-democracy uprising in Tiananmen Square, military coup attempts in the Philippines and the enthronement of Japan's Emperor Akihito. He was in Baghdad for the build-up to Desert Storm.

Whitaker was born and raised in the Philadelphia area. He graduated from Hobart and William Smith Colleges with a B.A. degree in American History and from Boston University with a master's degree in African American Studies. Whitaker also holds a master's degree in journalism from the University of California, Berkeley.
